Tennis Rules

- 1. Court reservations may be made a maximum of two days in advance using the Club's online scheduler or by calling the front desk. A member may reserve up to two courts a day, for a maximum of 90 minutes each, but there must be a minimum of four hours between the two reservations. The member who has made the reservation must be a player on the reserved court.
- 2. Reservations may not be made by different members of the same playing group to extend playing time for that group beyond 90 minutes. Such reservations, if made, will not be honored.
- 3. Play may continue beyond 90 minutes only if the court on which the members are playing has not been reserved. Members must immediately surrender the court to any arriving players who have reserved the court.
- 4. All members and all guests must sign in at the front desk prior to playing. Members who go directly to their court without checking in at the front desk will be considered noshows. The first no-show offense by a member will warrant a warning. The second noshow instance will result in second written warning. The third no-show offence will result in the member losing court reservation privileges for a period of one week.
- 5. All guest fees must be paid upon check-in at the front desk prior to play. If a member invites a guest(s) to play outside of Clubhouse hours, it is the member's responsibility to contact the front desk to inform them of this guest(s) and to pay the guest fee(s).
- 6. Members are expected to arrive promptly for their court reservation time but if running late, due to unforeseen circumstances, should contact the front desk.
- 7. If a player no longer intends to honor a reservation, he/she MUST cancel the reservation, either using the online scheduler or by calling the Club's front desk no later than 1 hour before his or her scheduled reservation. Not cancelling a reservation in a timely manner will result in a no-show.
- 8. Suitable tennis attire and tennis shoes must be worn at all times while on the courts.
- 9. Members and guests should demonstrate good sportsmanship at all times.
- 10. The Club has the right to close the clay courts without notice if weather conditions, such as wind and rain, threaten to damage them.

Players must immediately abandon play and seek shelter in the event of thunder. Play should not resume until 15 minutes have passed without thunder.
